Graduate's Perceptive

In 2007-2008, Guilford County Schools (including Dudley) had one of the 10 best graduation rates for black males according to a report released by the Schott Foundation for Public Education. The State of North Carolina reported a graduation rate of 65.6 percent for black males for 2007-2008 and 68.9 percent in 2009-2010

While this is reflective of the national norm, let us try to improve Dudley High School's graduation rate for black males. Let us set an astonishing goal of 70 percent for the 2010-2011 school year. 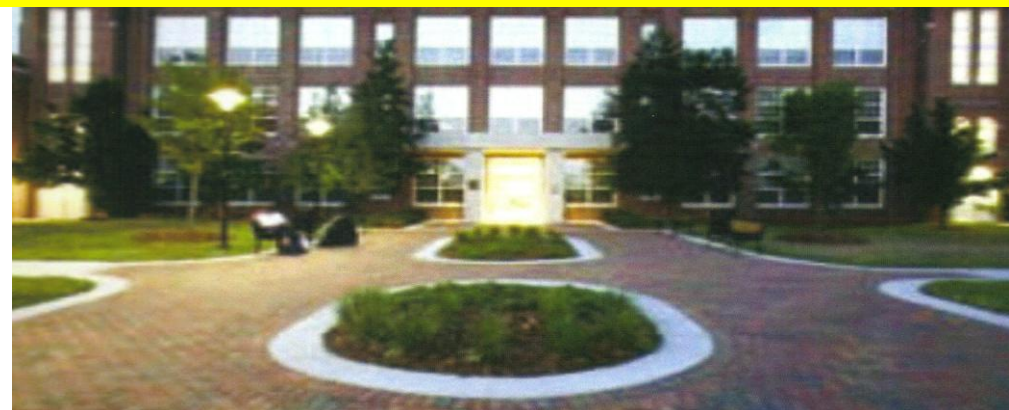
